Tender: Wool that is weak throughout the entire length of the fiber. Top: A continuous strand of partially manufactured wool, which has been scoured, carded and combed

Glossary of Wool Terms - Extension

A term referring to the actual feel of wool. Hank : A 560-yard (512 meter) unit of wool yarn would on a reel. Kemp: Brittle, chalky white, weak fiber found as an impurity in the fleece. Lanolin: Wool grease; this substance, sometimes called "yolk" is a secretion from the sebaceous glands of the sheep skin. Lock

Generic term used to describe wool with fineness approximately 27- 30microns. Humbug: Natural colours blended together to have the striped appearance of humbug sweets. Ingeo. Trade name for fibre made from pulped corn plants. Lambswool: Wool from sheep/animals during their first year of growth. Merino

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The removal of wool from around the eyes of a sheep to prevent wool-blindness. Wool: The textile fibre obtained from the fine, soft curly or wavy hair forming the coats of sheep and other animals, including cashmere and mohair from goats, qiviut from muskoxen, angora from rabbits, and camelids such dromedary camels, llama and alpaca.

Warp - The set of vertical (lengthwise) threads which make up the woven pattern. Weaving - Interlocking two sets of threads (or yarns) to form a length of fabric. Weft - The set of horizontal threads woven through the vertical warp, completing the pattern.

A cloth woven with a number of warps in sections, usually of a specific range of yarns either in solid colours or in stripes and woven with the same range of weft colours or stripes in the weft in the same sequence as the warp.

Glossary of Terms. Leasing of grazing rights of a paddock which is owned by another person. A method of measuring the mean fibre diameter of a sample of wool in which a test specimen (a measured mass of the scoured, dried and carded sample or a measured mass of silver), after exposure to a conditioning atmosphere, is compressed to a fixed volume and a current of air is passed through it.

Fibre: unspun wool, hair or vegetable material; Fleece: the wool covering of sheep or the entire coat after shearing; Flock: the collective noun for a group of sheep. Herd is used for alpacas and goats; Fly Strike: commonly used phrase to describe myiasis, an infestation of the wool, skin and flesh with blowfly or botfly maggots.

Glossary of terms 2ply A fine weight of yarn, tends to be used for lace garments. Tensions are generally given for use on 2.5mm needles at 32 stitches per 10cm but often larger needles are used to give an open, lacy look to the garment.

Bale - a wool pack containing a specified weight of pressed wool as regulated by industry authorities. Band - a flock with a large number of sheep, generally 1000, which graze on rangeland. Bell sheep - a sheep (usually a rough, wrinkly one) caught by a shearer, just before the end of a shearing run.

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
